Titolo: "Pre-birth inputs, social environment and inequality of individual outcomes. Evidence using (pseudo)twins data"

The relevance of family background in intergenerational transmission of socio-economic status is typically studied by collecting data on two adjacent generations. However inferences can be obtained by studying siblings correlations, under suitable assumptions on how children were raised. In particular studying the difference between monozygotic and dizygotic twins allow the measurement of the impact of pre-birth effects (including genetics). While waiting to match information on actual twins (collected by the Istituto Superiore di Sanità) with work careers collected in Inps archives, I have identified individuals who share family names, date and place of birth, and I have studied the correlation on incomes in these pairs.
